## Promoting and Tracking Environmental Sustainability in VET

09.12.2022

The project aims to support the **professional development** of vocational education practitioners environmental awareness by tracking and quantifying the environmental impact of the sector.

### Our goals:

- ξ Increase recognition of green skills among **75 vocational education practitioners**.
- ξ Increase uptake and adoption of green skills among **200 vocational training learners**.
- ξ Implementation of environmental and sustainability best practices among **30 vocational education and training organisations**.
- ξ Establishment of an active, focused network for staff and organisations to exchange resources, knowledge and best practices.

## ENVIROVET BEST PRACTICE TOOLKIT COMPLETED

This toolkit presents successfully implemented initiatives in 3 main areas (**Green Strategies, Green Pedagogical Approaches, Green Skills and Knowledge**) and aims to raise awareness of the innovative and positive best practices used among vocational education and training institutions and their leaders, trainers, and learners.

Using the finalised field research templates, all partners collected feedback from local/regional/national VET policy makers and VET centre staffs.

### III. TRANSNATIONAL PROJECT MEETING RIGA, LATVIA

The **3rd Transnational Partners Meeting** (TPM) has been held in Riga, Latvia on the 3rd of November 2022.

The consortium discussed current accomplishments, mainly highlighting to the results of the Best Practice Toolkit and of the first version of the Environmental Charter.

Through dissemination on social networks, a satisfactory number of engaged users was achieved, but with the imminent publication of the website, greater engagement of the project's target group is expected. ## Environmental Charter

Environmental Charter sets out the minimum requirements that a Vocational Education and Training (VET) organisation needs to meet to be considered environmental-friendly and a true agent of environmental change.

A green VET organisation adopts green-focused internal processes and procedures, which have been categorised according to the following 5 criteria:

1. General policies
2. Infrastructure and facilities
3. Vocational education and training
4. Teaching and training methodologies
5. Staff continuous training and personal development

## Further challenges:

EnviroVET Environmental Impact Measurement Tool - an online evaluation tool will allow users to compare and exchange best practices on environmentally friendly approaches to vocational education and training.

EnviroVET Facilitator eCourse - 30 hour e-course on green approach will target professionals working in the VET sector by equipping them with relevant skills and knowledge.
